### Board Meeting Minutes: January 28, 2015

**Board members present:** Sally Allen, President; Keith Harris, Vice President; Donna Whitten, Treasurer; Veronika Barnes, Secretary; Marilyn Goble, Director; Art Vasquez, Immediate Past President; **Also Present:** Robert Apodaca, Rockhound State Park.

1. Meeting called to order by President Sally. Minutes of October 29, 2014 meeting read; motion to approve by Donna, seconded by Keith, motion carried. (There were no board meetings in November due to Thanksgiving, or in December (lume-building day).
2. Treasurer's reports for Oct, Nov, Dec 2014 were read; motion to approve by Art, seconded by Marilyn, motion carried.
3. Treasurer presented year-end report. We overspent our budget by \$1582. This was primarily due to lower- than-expected revenues from the plant sales. **A special meeting of the board to address the 2015 budget is scheduled for Wednesday, Feb 18, at 10 am in the REB (Rockhound Education Building.)**

#### **ROBERT'S REPORT:**

1. Input of info/events at Rockhound to be submitted regionally, then on to Santa Fe for the State Parks website.
2. Selection of David Bencomo as the new Park Tech. He was a temporary hire, but is now permanent, beginning Feb 14<sup>th</sup>.
3. Regional meeting was held last week at Rockhound. In the fiscal year 2016 (beginning July 1), an amount of \$120,000 has been budgeted for renovations to the Rockhound Education Building.

#### **OLD/CONTINUING BUSINESS:**

1. The amended bylaws have been accomplished and will be presented to the general membership for a vote at the February 25<sup>th</sup> annual meeting.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

1. The 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration of Friends of Rockhound will be held in conjunction with the February annual meeting. Cake and refreshments will be served
2. Planning of a Saturday in September "Rockathon" is in the works. (Exact date to be established.) Two categories of walks: the shorter, easier "Jasper Trail," (called the Pebble Walk) and the longer, tougher "Thunder Egg Trail" (called the Boulder Walk.) Discussed were t-shirts, entry fees, awards, etc. Details to be worked out. The Board, as well as Robert, felt this was a great way to bring greater exposure and more people to our wonderful park.



We'd like to thank master hunting guide, Cecil Haas for an exceptional January presentation about "Ibex in the Floridas." Cecil's first experience at hunting the exotic Ibex, which are Iranian mountain goats, was way back in 1982 when his friend Dennis Kauffman drew his first ibex hunting tag. He was hooked! He and Dennis have been guiding and outfitting ever since. Cecil's talk was full of their adventures, pictures of the critters, and lots of good information about the animals and how difficult it is to hunt them. For instance, Petersons Bow Hunting magazine, September 2007 issue, stated that, "The New Mexico Ibex bow hunt is the most challenging bow hunt in the world---bar none."
